The funding would be used to modernize LYNX Central Station in Downtown Orlando by reconstructing bus bays and upgrading lighting to improve safety, reduce congestion, and enhance the efficiency and reliability of transit service for approximately 20,000 daily riders. This project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because it delivers targeted, cost-effective upgrades to LYNX Central Station that improve safety, reduce congestion, and enhance reliable transit access for tens of thousands of daily riders while lowering long-term operating and maintenance costs.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by chapter 53 of title 49 of the United States Code.
